"How long, O Lord, must I call for help? But you do not listen! 'Violence is everywhere!' I cry, but you do not come to save. Must I forever see these evil deeds? Why must I watch all this misery? Wherever I look, I see destruction and violence. I am surrounded by people who love to argue and fight. The law has become paralyzed, and there is no justice in the courts." (Habakkuk 1:2-3)

What happened to cause injustice and brokenness?

We did. Throughout time people have put their own interest ahead of others. This happens personally, in families, communities, and even entire civilizations. This striving for power and control causes injustice and oppression in the world.



We believe we know better than God. Our rebellion from God's perfect design causes injustice.

"Listen! The Lord's arm is not too weak to save you, nor is his ear too deaf to hear you call. It's your sins that have cut you off from God." (Isaiah 59:1-2)

We can get stuck in our brokenness without hope of being fully restored by God. That's an awful place to be!

"Oh what a miserable person I am! Who will free me from this life that is dominated by sin and death? Thank God! The answer is in Jesus Christ our Lord." (Romans 7:24-25a)

But there is hope! God came into the world

as a man named Jesus.

Jesus was righteous and just. He lived a perfect life. Yet, He was called a criminal and put to death. Jesus suffered injustice so He could provide true justice for those who believed He died for them. Jesus died because we are not perfect. We are selfish. We deserve to die. But Jesus took our place on the cross because of His great love for us. Three days after His death, He rose from the grave, proving He is God, and defeating death sin a



proving He is God, and defeating death, sin, and all evil in the world.

Jesus, out of deep love for each of us, paid the penalty for our rebellion by giving His life.

"For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all people." (1 Timothy 2:5-6)

If we choose to follow Jesus and make Him King of our lives, God promises to heal our brokenness by restoring us to His perfect design.

God does not want us to stay in our broken states. His mission is to restore and heal His entire creation. God is doing that now, and He invites us to join Him. He is inviting you to a restored life through His son, Jesus.

Surrendering your HEART:

selfishness. "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9)

Setting aside your <u>WILL</u>: We must surrender to Jesus as King.

"If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." (Romans 10:9)

You can put your faith in Jesus as you pray the following:

"God, I have not lived my life according to your design. My life is broken, and I recognize it's because of my sin. I need you. Please forgive me for pushing you away. God, I surrender my mind, heart, and will to you.

"I believe Jesus died on the cross and rose from the dead to pay the penalty of my rebellion. God, even when life gets really hard and unfair, I will trust in you, your love, and restoring power in my life.

In Jesus' name, Amen."



What's next?

- Get to know other people of faith. You are part of a big family now, and they can help you in many ways. Look for a good church.
- Get to know the new you. God is changing you. Talk to Him through prayer. Love Him with all your heart, mind, soul, and strength, AND love your neighbor as yourself (Matthew 22:37-
